My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Happy Easter! The Lord is risen, truly risen.

We have more reason to celebrate this year than most. After the devastating closures of our churches last year during the holiest season for Christians, we are once again able to celebrate together and partake of the Eucharist as a community of faith, surrounded by witnesses and the communion of saints.

This is not simply talk or an abstract concept. In the same way we know that Christ is truly present in the Eucharist, we also know that those who have gone before us continually sing before the throne, "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord." Many of our brothers and sisters have gone to the Lord during the pandemic, but we know they are not separated from us; they sing to the Lord and pray on our behalf. The prophet Isaiah spoke of it in the Old Testament, and it was reaffirmed by St. John in Revelation: "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord God almighty, who was, and who is, and who is to come."

As many of you may know, I submitted my resignation, as all bishops must do, on my 75th birthday. This may be my last Easter as your bishop, so I would like to reflect on what we have overcome together these last 12 years: We have faced a thousand-year flood, hurricanes, the tragedy of Mother Emanuel, protests and riots, a pandemic, and countless other obstacles to our faith. Yet here we remain. The faith of Catholics in South Carolina remains. This incredible trust and continued faithfulness are reinforced at Easter for a single reason: the holy Risen Lord, Jesus Christ.

As with all clergy, bishops are appointed, serve, and eventually retire. We come and we go. But Christ, the head of his Church *and* the cornerstone of his Church, remains the same yesterday, today and forever. We trust that, in believing in Him, we have eternal life. We have the hope of salvation and a future in the presence of our Lord — a future when we too will sing at the foot of the throne: "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord God!"

May God bless you and your families throughout this Easter season. Please keep me in your prayers and know that you remain in mine.

Mis queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo,

¡Felices Pascuas! El Señor ha resucitado, verdaderamente ha resucitado.

Tenemos más razones para celebrar este año que la mayoría. Después de los cierres devastadores de nuestras iglesias el año pasado durante la temporada más santa para los cristianos, podemos celebrar juntos y participar de la Eucaristía como una comunidad de fe, rodeada de testigos y la comunión de los santos.

Esto no es simplemente palabras o un concepto abstracto. De la misma manera que sabemos que Cristo está verdaderamente presente en la Eucaristía, también sabemos que aquellos que nos precedieron cantan continuamente ante el trono: “Santo, santo, santo es el Señor”. Muchos de nuestros hermanos y hermanas se han ido al Señor durante la pandemia, pero sabemos que no están separados de nosotros; cantan al Señor y oran por nosotros. El profeta Isaías habló de ello en el Antiguo Testamento, y fue reafirmado por san Juan en el Apocalipsis: “Santo, santo, santo, Señor Dios Todopoderoso, el que era y es y será”.

Como muchos de ustedes saben, presenté mi renuncia, como todos los obispos deben hacer, en mi 75 cumpleaños. Esta puede ser mi última Pascua como su obispo, por lo que me gustaría reflexionar sobre lo que hemos superado juntos estos últimos 12 años: Hemos enfrentado una inundación milenaria, huracanes, la tragedia de la Madre Emanuel, protestas y disturbios, una pandemia e innumerables otros obstáculos a nuestra fe. Sin embargo, aquí permanecemos. La fe de los católicos en Carolina del Sur permanece. Esta increíble confianza y fidelidad continua se refuerzan en la Pascua por una sola razón: el santo Señor Resucitado, Jesucristo.

Como con todo el clero, los obispos son nombrados, sirven y finalmente se retiran. Vamos y venimos. Pero Cristo, cabeza de su Iglesia y piedra angular de su Iglesia, sigue siendo el mismo ayer, hoy y siempre. Confiamos en que, al creer en Él, tenemos la vida eterna. Tenemos la esperanza de la salvación y un futuro en la presencia de nuestro Señor —un futuro cuando nosotros también cantaremos al pie del trono: “¡Santo, santo, santo es el Señor Dios!”.

Que Dios los bendiga a ustedes y a sus familias durante todo este tiempo de Pascua. Por favor, ténganme presente en sus oraciones y sepan que permanecen en las mías.
