**PARTS OF THE MASS SERIES —KNOW YOUR FAITH**

**Basic Priest Vestments —Part 2**

**The Chasuble**-a sleeveless outer garment worn by priests at Mass. In Roman times, this garment was a long cloak covering the body on all sides and fitted with a hood for bad weather. In the Old Testament the chasuble caught the blood of animals sacrificed by the high priest. In the New Testament it is a garment of sacrifice -Christ's sacrifice on the Cross.

**The Surplice**- a shortened form of the Alb and also made of white linen or cotton, this large-sleeved tunic is commonly worn by clergy during processions and when administering the Sacraments. It refers to ancient times when monks wore fur-lined robes when gathering to sing the psalms at various hours of the day.

**The Cassock**- a full-length fitted robe for ordinary use. Priests wear black, bishops wear purple, cardinals wear red, and white for pope.

**The Cope**- used mostly in processions, to Benediction of the blessed Sacrament or a Adoration service of the Holy Eucharist, this vestment is open in the front for easier carrying of various items especially the Monstrance or large books.

**PARTES DE LA SERIE MISA —CONOCE TU FE**

**Vestimentas Básicas de Sacerdote —Parte 2**

**La casulla:** una prenda exterior sin mangas que usaban los sacerdotes en la misa. En la época romana, esta prenda era una capa larga que cubría el cuerpo por todos lados y provista de una capucha para el mal tiempo. En el Antiguo Testamento la casulla recogía la sangre de los animales sacrificados por el sumo sacerdote. En el Nuevo Testamento es una prenda de sacrificio: el sacrificio de Cristo en la Cruz.

**La Sobrepelliz:** una forma abreviada del Alba y también hecha de lino blanco o algodón, esta túnica de manga larga es comúnmente usada por el clero durante las procesiones y cuando administra los Sacramentos. Se refiere a la antigüedad cuando los monjes usaban túnicas forradas de piel cuando se reunían para cantar los salmos a varias horas del día.

**La sotana:** una túnica ajustada de largo completo para uso ordinario. Los sacerdotes visten de negro, los obispos visten de púrpura, los cardenales visten de rojo y blanco para el Papa.

**La capa:** utilizada principalmente en procesiones, para la bendición del Santísimo Sacramento o un servicio de Adoración de la Sagrada Eucaristía, esta vestimenta está abierta en el frente para facilitar el transporte de varios artículos, especialmente la Custodia o libros grandes.
