



GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE February 27, 2022 8th Sunday in Ordinary Time

What we say and how we say it reveals the true intentions of our hearts. The content and manner of our speech is a window into the recesses of our souls. Our consciences, attitudes, sentiments, weaknesses, and motives are displayed. As much as we think we can hide the truth of our lives from others, we cannot. Who we really are is not only expressed on our lips but is written on our faces. Jesus says precisely this, "For every tree is known by its own fruit." What does the fruit of our lives say about us? Because we like to play the game of hide and seek with ourselves, in pretending that we are hiding we deflect attention others may give to us by becoming more critical of others. After all, the more time one can spend analyzing others' behavior the less time one has to look at his or herself. Often, the behaviors we abhor most in others are the very ones we are guilty of ourselves. We just don't know it yet. The more we put ourselves in the role of a judge, the more satisfaction and control we seem to achieve. Yet, what about ourselves? In focusing our attention on the beams in others' eyes, the aridity and barrenness of our lives goes unchecked. St. Ambrose reminds us that "no one heals himself by wounding another." Bringing our brothers and sisters down by being overly critical, serves no positive purpose. But the one who knows how easy it is to fall into sin and weakness and how quickly errors in judgment can be made, knows the depth of true compassion, mercy, and kindness. Having recognized our own poor choices, misguided opinions, negative emotions, and ability to do horrendous things, we can be more sympathetic and understanding of where others may be. We are designed to be mentors and guides to one another. In walking the journey together, we can help each other become the best we can be. Humility is the order of the day and the primary virtue that prevents us from being hypocrites. ©LPI



Quizás nos haría bien considerar lo que puede estar sucediendo dentro de nuestros hermanos y hermanas y moderar nuestro discurso crítico de lo que vemos que ocurre afuera. Mirar hacia adentro también nos ayudará a identificar nuestros propios pecados y debilidades para que podamos estar mejor posicionados para ofrecer el tipo de sabiduría y guía compasiva que realmente puede ser de ayuda a nuestros amigos. ©LPI

PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL

The parish pastoral council is a consultative body through which the Christian faithful are to “give their help in fostering pastoral activities” (Canon 536). The primary role of the parish pastoral council is to work with the pastor in determining a vision of life and ministry for the parish as a whole. This is accomplished by the establishment of reasonable goals and the objectives to reach these goals.

This is being done in an ongoing way through implementing the elements of our Parish Vision, which apply the decisions of the Synod of the Diocese of Charleston in all aspects of parish life and mission: Prayer and Worship, Evangelization, Christian Formation, Social Outreach, Community Building and Stewardship.

MEMBERSHIP

- 1) Members of the parish pastoral council are the pastor, parochial vicar, deacon(s), directors of evangelization, executive assistant, and appointed members of the parish in full communion with the Roman Catholic Church.
- 2) The membership should reflect the different facets of parish life and should be of a size appropriate to the size of the parish, but small enough to act effectively. The appointed and selected members are more in number than the ex-officio members.

PASTOR'S ROLE

- 1) The configuration of the council is left to the pastor. Its membership may be established by appointment of the pastor, after appropriate consultation or selection by the parishioners.
- 2) Council members serve a three-year term with vacancies filled as soon as possible through appointment by the pastor. For the sake of stability, terms are on a staggered basis. Terms may be renewed.

Esto se lleva a cabo continuamente a través de implementar los elementos de la Visión de nuestra Parroquia, la cual aplica las decisiones del Sínodo de la Diócesis de Charleston en todos los aspectos de la vida y misión parroquial: Oración y Adoración, Evangelización, Formación Cristiana, Extensión Social, Creación de Comunidad y Administración.

MEMBRESÍA

PAPEL DEL PASTOR

- 1) La configuración del consejo está a cargo del pastor. Su membresía puede ser establecida por asignación del pastor, después de la adecuada consulta o seleccionados por nuestros fieles.
- 2) Miembros del consejo sirven términos de tres años y se llenan las plazas vacías tan pronto como sea posible. Para el bien de la estabilidad, los términos son en una base alterna.


