FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What is the Catholic Appeal of South Carolina?

The Catholic Appeal of South Carolina (CASC), is a primary source of funding to help sustain and expand the ministries of the 94 parishes, 21 missions, 33 Catholic schools, and multiple agencies throughout the Diocese of Charleston.

Why should people give to the Appeal?

We are stewards of the gifts God blesses us with, and this includes our money. Yes, we might EARN it, but only because God has first given us our talents and gifts to utilize in the world. We are called to share what we have been given. Jesus said, "Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me."

Why do we need these ministries and programs?

The Catholic Church offers outreach and serves the needs of so many people in our diocese and beyond – Catholic or not. We are called to serve others and to invite them into communion with Jesus Christ and His Church by living out the Gospel. The ministries supported by the Appeal provide tangible ways to help so many who are in need, offer education and formation to build up strong disciples in the faith, education for our future priests, and so much more.

Does my gift make a difference, even if it's small?

What's the difference between the Catholic Appeal of South Carolina and the Bicentennial Campaign?

The Church's mission is advanced in important ways through both the Catholic Appeal of South Carolina and the Bicentennial Campaign. In some areas, the Appeal supports the daily operation of critical ministries throughout our diocese, while the Bicentennial Campaign funds more strategic, comprehensive, long-range, and larger scale initiatives to help the Church serve its people and prepare for doing the Lord's work in the future.

¿Qué es la Colecta Católica de Carolina del Sur?

Es la fuente primaria de ingresos para mantener y expandir los ministerios de las 94 parroquias, 21 misiones, 33 escuelas católicas y múltiples agencias en toda la Diócesis de Charleston.

¿Por qué debemos contribuir a la Campaña?

The Church –Part 1

The Building— with the apostles and prophets as the foundation and Christ himself the cornerstone, a temple of the Lord takes shape. Each member of the community of believers is a living stone of the structure, resting upon Jesus.

Narthex—a vestibule leading to a nave in the church building.

Nave—the center part of the church from the lobby area/gathering space to the altar surrounded by aisles.

Pews—seats, that branch off from the aisles, used by the members of the congregation.


O my God,
