


GSCL LIFE CONFERENCE 2024



Frequently Asked Questions

What is the Catholic Appeal of South Carolina?

The Catholic Appeal of South Carolina (CASC) is a primary source of funding to help sustain and expand the ministries of the 95 parishes, 21 missions, 32 Catholic schools, and multiple ministries throughout the Diocese of Charleston and the state of South Carolina.

Can the funds raised by the Catholic Appeal be used for anything other than their stated purpose?

No! Donations to CASC are restricted for use to the stated ministries, programs and Catholic education only. Your donations directly support and grow these missions — they are not to “keep the lights on at the Chancery.”

Does my gift make a difference, even if it's small?

Yes! Each of us must discern what we can give in response to God's generosity to us. All intentional gifts are acts of good stewardship and faith. Together, everyone in the diocese makes a tremendous difference — accomplishing far more than any one of us could on our own. Mother Teresa reminded us, “Not all of us can do great things, but we can do small things with great love.”

¿Qué es la Colecta Católica de Carolina del Sur?

La Colecta Católica de Carolina del Sur (CASC, por sus siglas en inglés) es una fuente primaria de financiamiento para ayudar a sostener y expandir los ministerios de las 95 parroquias, 21 misiones, 32 escuelas católicas y múltiples ministerios en toda la Diócesis de Charleston.

¿Pueden los fondos recaudados por la Colecta ser utilizados para cualquier otra cosa que no sea su propósito declarado?

¡No! Las donaciones la Colecta Católica están restringidas para su uso a los ministerios, programas y educación católica declarados solamente. Su donativo apoyará y hará crecer directamente estas misiones, no deben "mantener las luces encendidas en la Cancillería".

¿Mi donativo hace la diferencia, incluso si es pequeño?
