ADVENT WREATH

Rich in symbolism, yet profoundly simple, the Advent wreath serves as a visible reminder of anticipation-slowly watching the light march forward, one week at a time. The wreath is made of evergreens, which signify life everlasting. The circular wreath has no beginning or end, symbolizing God's eternal nature. Finally, in ancient times, a wreath would decorate the head of the victor in a competition. Here, we are reminded of Christ's victory and glory from his humble "beginnings" in the womb of Mary to his triumph over death and Ascension into heaven.

Each of the four candles represents a week of Advent, with a new candle lit on each of the four Sundays of the liturgical season. Three of the candles are purple, signifying penance, prayer, and preparation. The rose candle, lit on the third Sunday of Advent, known as Gaudete Sunday ("rejoice"—the first word in the antiphon for that liturgy), symbolizes a lightness and joy because

Advent is halfway over and the light of Christ that much closer. As the light advances from one candle to the next, we are reminded of God's action throughout salvation history and the ages leading to his true light coming into the world (see Jn 1:9). As Fr. William Saunders of the Arlington diocese puts it, the lighting of the candles signifies "the expectation and hope surrounding our Lord's first coming into the world and the anticipation of His second coming to judge the living and the dead."

Many families incorporate the daily lighting of the Advent wreath as they pray before dinner. Prayers for this daily lighting can be found in traditional Catholic devotional books or by searching "Advent wreath prayers" online.
