SACRAMENT OF THE SICK REQUEST: This is the proper name for what is sometimes mistakenly called "Last Rites" or "Extreme Unction." It is meant for anyone who has a serious illness, is facing surgery, or even is dealing with the effects of old age. It

should not be limited to the dying. As the Letter of James says clearly, "Are there any who are sick among you? Let them send for the priests of the Church, and let the priests pray over them, anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord..." It is a sacrament of healing for spirit, mind, and often body. It is administered at a monthly Mass, usually on the first Monday, and anytime on request.

Está destinado a cualquier persona que tiene una enfermedad grave, se enfrenta a una cirugía, o incluso si está tratando con los efectos de la ancianidad. No debe limitarse a los moribundos. Como dice claramente la Carta de Santiago: "¿Hay alguno que esté enfermo entre ustedes? Que envíen a los sacerdotes de la Iglesia, y que los sacerdotes oren sobre ellos, ungiéndolos con aceite en el nombre del Señor..." Es un sacramento de sanación para el espíritu, la mente y con frecuencia el cuerpo. Se administra en una Misa mensual, por lo general el primer lunes, y en cualquier momento a petición.
